CAPACITY BUILDING WORKSHOP ON HAPPY CLASSROOM BY CBSE

“There is no path to happiness. Happiness is the path.”

Keeping happiness paramount, a one-day Capacity Building Program on Happy Classroom was organized under the aegis of the Central Board of Secondary Education (CBSE) at K R Mangalam World School, Vikaspuri. It was conducted by Ms Maninder Pal Kaur, Principal, Shiv Modern School and Ms.Aishwarya Taneja, Academic Coordinator, Bal Bharti Public School, Dwarka. The primary objective of this course was on establishing joyful classrooms and working with unrestrained enthusiasm. The session began on a light note with a laughter exercises with the aid of a story, self empowering words on a leaf cut out, followed by an introduction to Happiness and how a happy teacher can create a happy classroom leading to happy individuals.

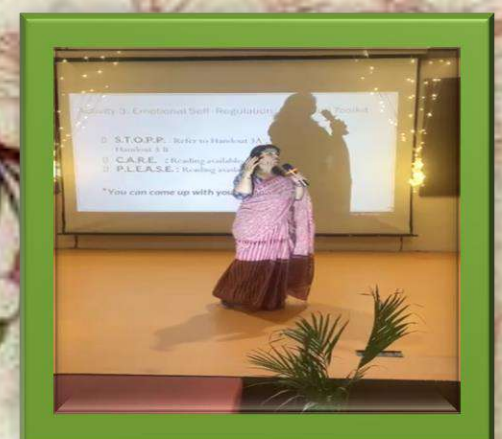
The workshop agenda included a discussion on EQ(Emotional Quotient). The teachers were asked to state their perspective on the 4 core EQ skills (i.e., self-awareness, self management, social awareness and managing relationships) through numerous interactive activities to keep them actively involved. Teachers were divided into groups and asked to perform a skit on self regulation using the acronym- S.T.O.P , C.A.R.E, P.L.E.A.S.E on the basis of incidents they have encountered in their classrooms and ways to proactively overcome them.

Just like every coin has two sides, positive emotions come with negative emotions now and then. Ways to recognise, acknowledge and cope up with negative emotions were effectively shown through activities such as , writing them on a piece of paper, crumbling and throwing them away. Also, an art integrated activity to let go of negative thoughts was done by all the participants to let the flower of positivity bloom in them. The resource person also enlightened on FBA (Functional Behaviour Analysis), an approach to understand the reason for misbehavior in classrooms and techniques which can be used in the classroom to overcome them in detail.

Furthermore, asserting how a happy teacher can act as a catalyst of happy classroom. By self reflective activities, teachers were motivated to work on the happiness score and made to ponder on areas where they need improvement and attention.

The distinction between mind full and mindfulness was vividly elucidated by the resource people. All the participants were asked to rate themselves on the happiness scale designed by Seligman, an eminent psychologist and formulate their own happiness formula. Few of the formulas shared were – $H = F \times F - MT$ (Happiness = Familiarity x Fun – Mobile Time) , $H = M \times A - NE$ (Happiness = Mindfulness x Appreciation- Negative emotions) and many more.

The significance of the Storytelling Approach and Total Physical Response (TPR) in classroom teaching was also taken up with the help of approvingly interactive video. The session concluded with a ‘Mood Meter’ wherein every participant was invited on stage to put the slip of their name expressing their current mood in accordance with the board displaying various moods. A motivational song was put up , everyone danced their heart out to forget every worry, negative thought and rejuvenate themselves to the fullest.

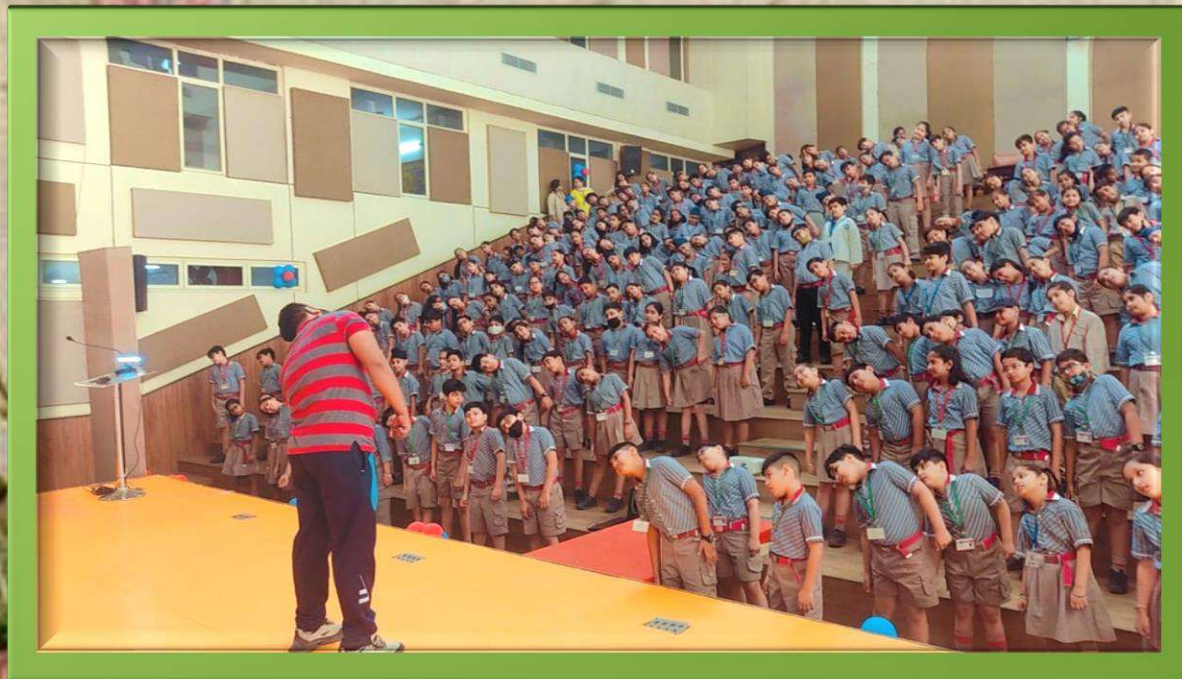
World Health Day Celebration 2023

'The greatest gift you can give your family and the world is a healthy you...'

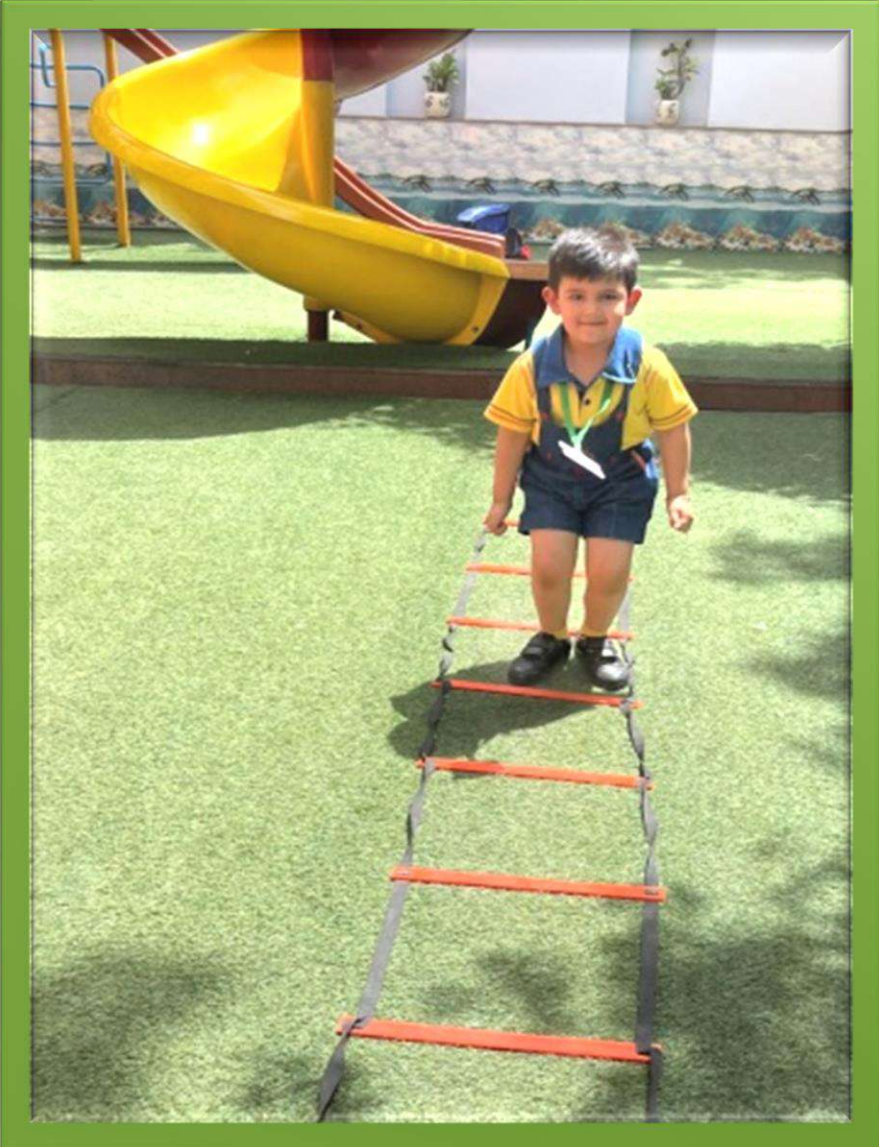

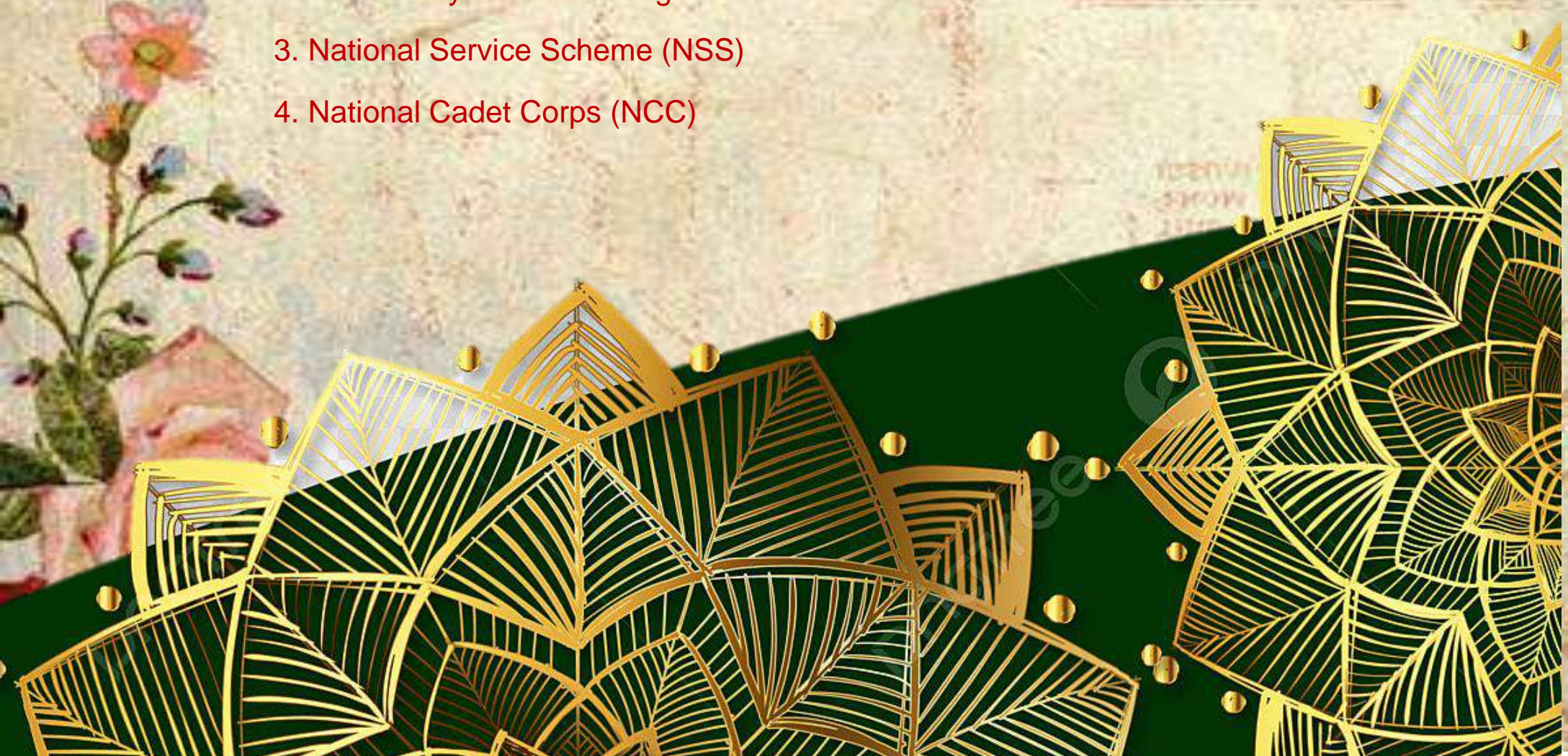


NURTURING HUMANITY

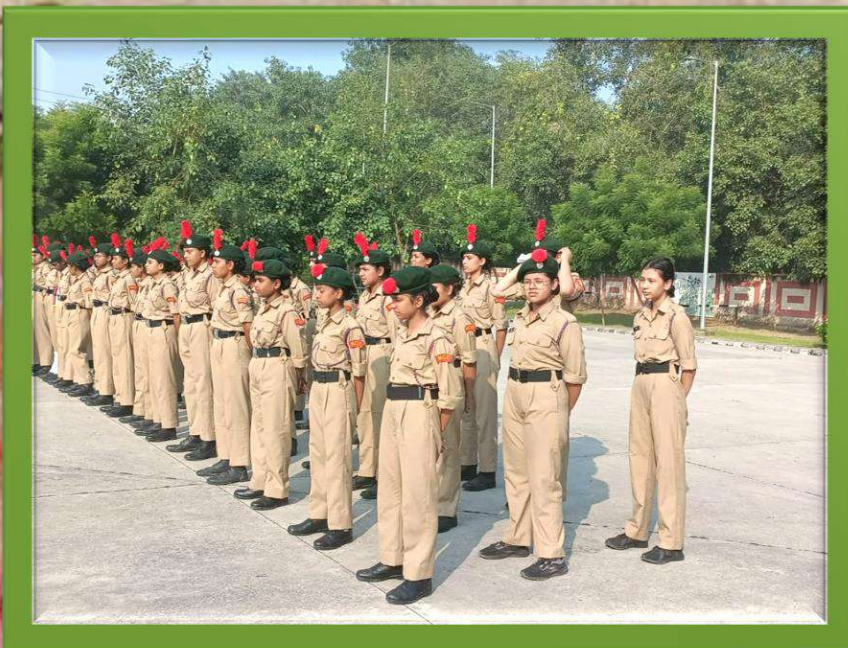


National Service Scheme
