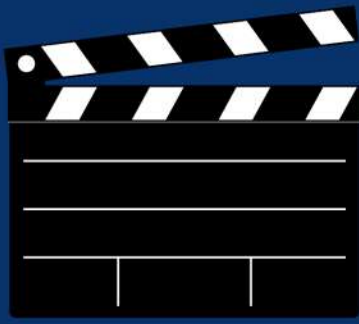
GRADE 6 ASSEMBLY

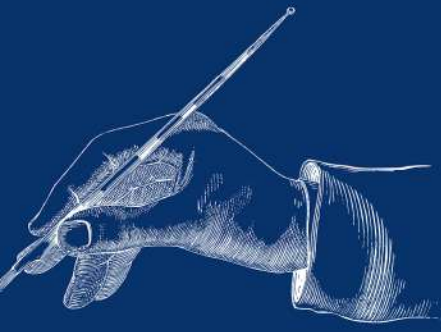


HELEN O'GRADY THEATRE IN EDUCATION PROGRAMME
